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Study visit at University of Veterinary Science in Budapest (Állatorvostudományi Egyetem, Budapest) was conducted in the period from 9th to 24th October 2016, in the framework of Tempus EDUVET project. Primary objective of the trip was exchange of experiences regarding the teaching process in subject Veterinary Radiology, and professional training.

During the visit, I was able to follow the work of the Department of Pathology (E block of campus).

During basic studies, students take semester IV (V, VI, VII and VIII) items from the fields of pathology. Classes are held in Hungarian and English. Lectures in Pathology held are held in the auditorium inside the campus by oral presentation, using modern audiovisual methods. Practical classes are held at the Department of Pathology. Students are introduced to the exercises execution technique necropsy segment by an organic system to the VIII semester independently performed necropsies. Working with students is conducted in small groups (eight to ten students). For the exercises in the necropsy were separated two rooms (30m² and 60m²) that fully meet the need for exercise.

Before entering the hall for necropsy, students are covered in the locker room which is part of the building where there is room. In the locker room there are three rooms: the city dressing (20m²) where each student has his own locker for storage wardrobe, a city of white coats, protective nipples and caps for each student (15m²) and bathroom (10m²).

In addition to the exercise of necropsy, students learn the technique of making histopathological specimens and their recognition. In the histopathology room (40m²) next to the microscope students have monitors connected to a teacher computer demonstrating each histopathological preparation. The number of students is 10-15 on the histological exercises.
